



LUBBOCK MONTEREY CHAPTER OF AMBUCS MISSION STATEMENT:

Inspiring people to conquer challenges related to mobility and independence, through a nation-wide network of volunteers working in partnership with physical, occupational and speech therapy; by providing Amtryke adaptive trykes, scholarships for therapists and many forms of community services. The Lubbock Monterey Chapter of AMBUCS is a 501c3. Funding was originally raised through having a hamburger restaurant at the South Plains Fairgrounds.

Beginning in 2019, we had our first SummerFest Event. At SummerFest Event 2025, we successfully raised \$112,000 and outgrew our third event center. We anticipate continued growth in attendance and raising funds with SummerFest.

We also depend on donations and sponsorships. We have been fortunate in obtaining life-long sponsorships and look forward growing our gracious community involvement with sponsorships.

Since 1960, community service projects include...

- Lubbock Challenger Little League program. This league has been in existence for 30+ years and is designed for children with disabilities.
- On an average fiscal year, we give away 20+ therapeutic Amtrykes at no cost to the recipients. During our 2025-2026 fiscal year, we are anticipating giving away 30+ therapeutic Amtrykes.
- On an average fiscal year, we provide \$34,000 in scholarships to the Professional Development School at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center. Our scholarship funding assists students who seek a physical, occupational, speech-language pathologists, or audiology education. During our 2025-2026 fiscal year, we are anticipating giving \$60,000 in scholarships.
- December 2025 is our fifth Christmas luncheon with the Arrow Foster and Adoption Service. This includes Santa and Mrs. Claus who hand out requested gifts to the Arrow Foster and Adoption Service children. Requested gifts are purchased and wrapped with each child's name.

Past Funding: HUB City ADA Playground Maxy Park, Trips for Make a Wish® Children Refurbished a room at the Ronald McDonald House, Children Miracle Network, Women's protective Service, Christmas for the Boys and Girls Ranch, Grant to the UMC Team Rehab Neuro and Pediatric Center for Parkinson's therapy equipment and various funding to other 501c3 organizations in the Lubbock area.
